SPECIAL CLASSES

CLASSICS

Declaration of all special classes must be made in the Horse show office by 4:00 p.m. the day before the class takes place. Riders are required to wear formal attire in all special classes. Riders must ride for awards. A suitable horse should be available. Failure to show up for the awards presentation in these classes will result in the forfeiture of prize money.

Trophy to first, ribbons through 12, and prize money divided as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%.

The second round of each division will be the first round of the classic. Exhibitors must enter the classic prior to the start of the first round class. Scratches are not permitted after the first round class has begun. See the time Schedule for the designated first round class. Horses must have entered, shown, and completed the course in at least two of the respective hunter division classes over fences at this show. To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability and manners to count. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. To be shown over a course of approximately 10 jumps of height designated by qualifying division. The twelve horses with the highest scores from the first round will return to jump a second round over a different course. In the event of equality in the first round, all equal scored will return for the second round. Scores will be combined from the first round with the second round to determine overall winners.

Each class must have a minimum of two judges. All judges will sit together and provide one score. One judge must be an R judge, the other may be either an R or r judge. The judging panel will provide one score and the scores from each round will be either averaged or added as specified in the prize list to obtain the overall total for each horse. No judging panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round.

The first round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. After the judges base score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points).

The second round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, movement, handiness and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. After the judges' base score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped.

The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points). Overall Score - The final score from each round will be either averaged or added as specified in the prize list to obtain the overall total for each horse.

Prize money must be paid to a minimum of 12 places as follows: 30%, 22%, 13%, 8%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 3%, 3%, 2%, 2%, 2%

Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

RULES, REGULATIONS & GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The 103rd Annual Flintridge Autumn Classic are covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF and PCHA Rule Books and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. *A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined © USEF 2016 3 GR9 COMPETITION PRIZE LISTS AND ENTRIES Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee.* Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) *citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation*, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

2. FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT: By entering a Federation- licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

3. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY: Every horse entered for competition will be under the control the Horse Show

Management, but Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Horse Show and its officials, employees, directors, officers, Flintridge Riding Club, Flintridge Autumn Classic LLC, and its Sponsors, etc for any loss or accident to his horse, horses, employees or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

4. MANAGEMENT: Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by Horse Show Management- their decision to be final. Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate or change judges and officials; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Management reserves the right to combine or cancel. Management reserves the right to limit entries in a class. Refused entries will be returned.

5. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: By signing the entry blank, the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Loungeur acknowledges that horseback riding, particularly jumping, is a dangerous activity and involves inherent risks that may cause serious injury and in some cases death because of the unpredictable nature and irrational behavior of horses, regardless of their training and past performance and expressly assumes all such inherent risks whether identified herein, in the entry blank, or in the Federation Rules and Regulations. A horse, without warning or any apparent cause, can buck, stumble. Fall, rear, bite, kick, run, make unpredictable movements, spook, jump obstacles, step on a person's foot or push a person-all of which may cause the rider or observer to fall or be jolted, resulting in serious injury or death. A horse may also become loose and cause injury to an observer or rider or to another horse-a loose horse can run at full gallop in a panic and run into objects or persons or other horses. The Show Ground Facilities are bordered by highways/roads and thus noise from traffic and other sources occurs that can and will cause a horse to unexpectedly spook or react quickly. The Show Ground Facilities contain roads or driveways that are traversed by cars, golf carts, tractors, trailers and heavy equipment all of which may spook a horse. The above warnings and risks are meant as an example of some of the risks that are inherent and may be encountered but it is agreed this is not an exhaustive list and there are numerous additional conditions and/or events that may result in injuries while participating in the Competition and/ or being present on the Show Ground Facility.

6. THE FOLLOWING IS REQUIRED FOR EACH ENTRY:

A. One owner and one horse per Entry Form, and forms may

be reproduced. Entry Forms must include: Name, mailing address, telephone, social security number or tax ID number, and signature of owner or authorized agent, trainer, parent guardian, and all riders.

B. Name, address, telephone and Social Security number for PAYEE if different than owner.

C. Name and Date of birth of minor exhibitors and signature of parent or guardian, a trainer signature may not substitute. Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold the Horse Show, Flintridge Autumn Classic LLC, and the Flintridge Riding Club and staff harmless for injury to such minor(s).

D. *USEF name of horse, and the correct description of horse, USHJA Recording, or ID number.*

E. *USEF, USHJA, and PCHA membership numbers for owner, trainer, and all riders.*

7. PAYMENT: Include Nomination and Stall Fees as a deposit for each entry. **For the Flintridge Autumn Classic, make checks payable to Flintridge Autumn Classic LLC.** A signed open check or valid credit card number is required at time of check-in before numbers will be issued. A 3.5% credit card fee will be applied to all credit card transactions and is nonrefundable for all transactions.

8. REFUNDS: Before the closing date of entries, all fees are refundable less a \$35.00 *office charge*. After the close of entries, nominating and stall fees are not refundable.

9. POST ENTRIES: Entries received after September 8th but before the Monday of each show week will pay a \$75.00 late fee. All entries received at the show will pay a \$150.00 late fee.

10. ADDS/SCRATCHES: All adds must be made by 4:00 pm the day prior to each class. No entries will be accepted for a class scheduled on the same day. **In the unusual case the time schedule allows a management approved add the day of a class, the entry fee will be double.** Horses and riders who go in a class without entering will pay a fee of \$50.00. All scratches must be received in the show office before the start of the class in writing to be considered for a refund; scratches via phone call or at the gate will NOT be considered. In divisions that are entered by complete section, no refund will be considered if the horse shows in any class of the division. Young horse classes must be entered by Wednesday of each show week. Management reserves the right to cancel young horse classes after 4:00 pm on Wednesday if numbers do not warrant running the class.

11. RAIN: In the event of rain prior to the Show, it is the rider's responsibility to call Show Management to determine whether the show is cancelled.

12. RESPONSIBILITY OF PAYMENT OF SERVICES AND SUPPLIES: All owners and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their animals, agents, or employees, to stalls, buildings and other properties on the

If excessive cleanup is required after the show, there will be a \$500 fee charged. Trainers are encouraged to supervise their staff to avoid this fee.

Show grounds and shall be billed accordingly. All bills for veterinary, farrier services and feed/bedding are due and payable during the Show. Management reserves the right to deduct any unpaid veterinary, farrier and feed/bedding bills from premium money due the exhibitor. Any exhibitor not meeting his obligations to the official Show Veterinarian, farrier and feed/bedding vendor will be termed an undesirable exhibitor and entries from that exhibitor may not be accepted at subsequent shows.

13. PRIZE MONEY: Prize Money Payout: In order to receive a prize money check, the prize money recipient must provide within 30 days: a social security number, federal tax id number or tax identification number to the show secretary by Sunday of the current competition. **NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID/MAILED UNLESS THE PRIZE MONEY RECIPIENTS SOCIAL SECURITY/FEDERAL TAX ID NUMBER/ TAX ID NUMBER IS PROVIDED TO THE SHOW SECRETARY WITHIN 30 DAYS FROM THE COMPLETION OF THE SHOW.** The Internal Revenue Service requires 30% of prize money won by foreign exhibitors to be withheld. Foreign exhibitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and are required to complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status Form. Management reserves the right to adjust the prize money of any class at any time. No prize money will be paid to classes that are run with fewer than 3 entries. Jumper classics require a minimum of 6 entries to be held or they will be combined or canceled, and may be run with no prize money.

14. RETURNED CHECKS/CHARGEBACKS: Checks returned by the bank or credit card chargebacks for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A \$50 penalty will be assessed for each returned check or chargeback OR 10% of the face value of the check or chargeback, whichever is greater. Accounts will be given ten (10) days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be reported to the U.S. Equestrian Federation, Inc., PCHA and other appropriate association(s) for further disciplinary action. Checks will not be deposited a second time. In the case that the debt is not cleared within 30 days of the conclusion of the show, all prize money will be forfeited.

A declined credit card will be resubmitted and charged a \$50 declined credit card fee. Returned checks will be charged a \$50 returned check fee. A closed account, stop payment, incorrect or incomplete credit card information or a charge back will be turned over to sanctioning organizations

15. UNPAID CHARGES: Any exhibitor leaving the show with an unpaid balance will be billed for these charges and a \$75 billing fee will be added to the total due. Until these charges are settled, all further entries of rider and owner will be returned.

16. SAFETY REGULATIONS: Unauthorized use of the light fixtures will result in removal of your appliance. Smoking or open flame devices are not permitted within the stables. Keep flammable decorations to a minimum. Electrical outlets are provided.

17. CLOSED RINGS: Horses are not permitted in any ring where a course is set, or when there is equipment in the ring. Horses and riders must yield immediately for watering and dragging. Violations of the above mentioned rules may be considered cause for elimination from the show. \ Private transactions involving stalls are not permitted. Management reserves the right to limit tack stalls. Stall fees are not refundable after the entry closing date. Trailer-ins are permitted with management's

18. RING INFORMATION: All rings are composed of sand and fiber. The dimensions are estimated at Oval- 286'x 127', Ring 2-230' length, corners 134', 118' wide. Upper & FRC Ring-150' x 270'.

19. STABLING: \$375 per stall. Portable stalls of metal and canvas construction, with stall doors under canvas. No straw bedding will be permitted-only shavings. However, we cannot guarantee stabling for post entries, and we recommend that your entries be received before the closing date. The show office handles all stall transactions and charges.

20. FEED AND BEDDING: All feed and bedding will be ordered through showgroundslive.com. Orders must be made by 1 P.M. each day for same-day delivery.

21. TIES: In all jumper classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. All other ties will be determined by time taken to complete the first round.

22. SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Gate Stewards are schooling supervisors and have absolute authority to scratch riders who do not follow USEF, FEI or appropriate association schooling rules.

23. NUMBERS: Management will provide a number card for each competitor which shall be worn clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Riders wearing the wrong number or no number at all MAY be eliminated from the class by the judges.

24. DOGS: Dogs and other pets must be confined to the Stable Area. Dogs must be on a leash at all times. Stray dogs and dogs in violation will be impounded by Animal Control authorities. Under no circumstances are dogs allowed at the arenas.

25.VACCINATION INFORMATION: Beginning December 1, 2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation-licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. The management in consultation with respected veterinarians and local animal health authorities strongly recommend and urge that all horses attending the show follow a two-part West Nile vaccination protocol consisting of a primary vaccination, followed by a booster 3-6 weeks later. Should you have any questions please contact the CDFAC.

26. ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: Trucks and trailers will enter the Club grounds through gate "3" on Oak Grove Drive, north of the main gate. There will be no exceptions to this rule. There will be limited automobile parking space at gate "3". Additional parking is available in the parking lot at gate "1" on Foothill Blvd. on the south side of the Flintridge Riding Club grounds. Please note North Gate will be closed during the Show. **The Flintridge Autumn Classic: Stalls will be available at 10:00, Wednesday, September 2. All stalls must be vacated by Sunday, September 28.**

28. PROTEST: Any USEF member lodging a protest must first deposit \$200 (non-members \$300) payable to Flintridge autumn classic LLC with the Show Secretary, which sum shall be forfeited to the Horse Show, if same is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed by the protester and filed within 48 hours of the occurrence of the alleged violation. A protest may be filed with the Show Manager, the Federation Hearing Committee or Show Secretary. If the protest is sustained, the entries standing next in award shall be moved up accordingly. See USEF GR603 and GR603.1.

29. HELMET RULE: All hunter/jumper riders will be required to wear ASTM-SEI certified safety helmets in all USEF sanctioned competitions as of December 1, 2001. The new rule puts the onus on parents and trainers to make sure that all exhibitors wear one of the 65 helmets that are currently approved by the American Society of Testing Materials/Safety Equipment Institute. Under the rule, judges, stewards and show management are obligated to check out helmets they suspect may not be ASTM-SEI approved and to prevent all exhibitors from competing if the helmet does not comply with the new rule.

30. DRUG TESTING: State of California drug testing rules apply. For a copy contact the Show Office.

31. GOLF CARTS AND BICYCLES: will be used in the Stable Area ONLY. (see GR301.7): Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offenses. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

32.PARKING: Parking allowed in designated areas only. Violators parked in NO PARKING ZONES and FIRE LANES will be issued citations and/or towed from the premises at the owner's expense. There are Handicap parking areas in the Stable Area and public parking lot.

33.WASHING HORSES: Nozzles are required on all hoses to help conserve water.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER Sections offered and requirements: Adult Amateurs – may be split into three (3) sections. **Cross Entry: Riders:** Riders may not cross enter into any Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9" or High Performance Hunter class at the same competition. Exception - under saddle classes. Adult Amateur Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same competition with fences exceeding 3'3" except Jumper Classes not exceeding 1.25m, Equitation and Medal Classes, and the USHJA National Hunter Derby. Riders may cross enter between the Adult Amateur Hunter and the Amateur Owner section if the rider owns the horse he or she is showing in the Adult Amateur section. An Adult Amateur rider may ride an Amateur Owner Hunter in the A/O Under Saddle Class for an Amateur Owner Hunter rider that has more than one horse entered. No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Horses:** Horses may not cross enter into any Amateur Owner hunter class (at the same show). No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Horse and Rider Combination:** No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Fence Height:** 3'0" with spreads not to exceed the fence height. Courses will not be adjusted for ponies. The Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse section may only be combined with the Children's Hunter Pony and Low Children's Hunter Horse sections after those sections have been combined and still do not meet the three (3) entry minimum. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: Low Adult Amateur Hunter.

AMATEUR JUMPER: Sections offered and requirements: 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper, 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper. **Cross Entry:** No cross entry restrictions at one day competitions. **Rider:** Any competitor that competes in any class set at over 1.25m is ineligible to compete in an Amateur Jumper class set below 1.20m at that competition. **Horse/**

Pony: n/a. **Horse and Rider Combination:** n/a. **Fence Height:** Amateur Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m. Amateur Jumper 1.10m for the first class of the section. In all other classes of the section fences to be set no lower than 1.10m and no higher than 1.15m. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** 1.00/1.05m Junior's and 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six (6) in either section. A Children's Hunter rider may ride a Junior Hunter in the Junior Hunter Under Saddle class for a Junior Hunter rider that has more than one horse entered. No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Horses/Ponies:**

No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Horse and rider combination:** No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Classics:** Three (3) entries are required to conduct a Hunter Classic. **Fence Height:** 3'0" with spreads not to exceed fence height. In and outs are permitted. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** If there are fewer than three (3) entries, the Children's Hunter section may be combined with the Adult Amateur Hunter section. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Children's Hunter Horse.

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. **Cross Entry: Riders:** Riders may not cross enter at the same competition into any class/section where fences exceed 3'0" **Fence Height:** 2'6" **Combining/Dividing Sections:** If there are fewer than three (3) horses entered in the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, then they may be combined and judged with the Children's Hunter Ponies or the Low Adult Amateur Hunter section. If there are still fewer than three (3) entries after the Children's Hunter Pony section has been combined with the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, these sections may only then

If there are still fewer than three (3) ponies after the Small/Medium and Large sections have been combined, the Children's Hunter Pony sections may combine with the Low Children's Hunter Horse section. If there are still fewer than three (3) entries after the Children's Hunter Small/Medium and Large Pony sections have been combined with the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, these sections may only then combine with the Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse section. **Classics:** A minimum of three (3) entries are required to conduct a Children's Hunter Pony Classic. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Children's Hunter Pony.

JUNIOR JUMPER Sections offered and Requirements: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper, 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper. **Cross Entry:** No cross entry restrictions at one day competitions. **Rider:** Any competitor that competes in any class set at over 1.25m is ineligible to compete in a Junior Jumper class set below 1.20m at that competition. **Horse/Pony:** n/a. **Horse and Rider Combination:** n/a. **Fence Height:** Junior Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m. Junior Jumper 1.10m for the first class of the section. In all other classes of the section fences to be set no lower than 1.10m and no higher than 1.15m. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** 1.00/1.05m Junior and 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six (6) in either

section. If after combining the 1.00/1.05m sections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.00/1.05m sections with the 1.10/1.15m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height.

1.10/1.15m Junior and 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six (6) in either section. If after combining the 1.10/1.15m sections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.10/1.15m sections with the 1.00/1.05m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper section, 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper section.

AGE GROUP EQUITATION: CHILDREN'S/JUNIOR SECTION Refer to GR1131. **Fence Height: Equitation 11 & Under:** Minimum 2'6", maximum 2'9" - management must state height at which class will be offered. Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout. Combinations not permitted. **Equitation 12-14:** Minimum 2'9", maximum 3'3" - management must state height at which class will be offered. Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout. Combinations are optional. **Equitation 15-17:** Minimum 3'0", maximum 3'5" - management must state height at which class will be offered. Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout. Combinations are optional. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** Competition management may offer Age Group Equitation classes divided at their discretion. Equitation that is offered by age will be awarded points that will be credited to the age groups defined in GR1131 or the relevant Zone Specifications. If the Equitation 11 & Under section is combined with the Equitation 12-14 section, the combined section will be run in accordance with the Equitation 12-14 specifications with optional combinations. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Equitation 11 & Under, Equitation 12-14, Equitation 15-17.

New Jumper Chapter Rules

Effective Dec 1st for the 2024 Competition Year

JP102 Horse Welfare

2. Conduct outside of the competition ring: Any action(s) against a horse by an exhibitor, deemed excessive by a judge, Federation Steward, Certified Schooling Supervisor or Competition Veterinarian anywhere on the competition grounds may be punished by official warning or elimination from the class. Such action(s) could include, but are not limited to: excessive or improper use of the whip, spurs, reins, rider's weight or rider's hands; lunging a visibly exhausted horse; lunging an obviously lame horse; chasing a horse with a lunge whip or other inappropriate use of the whip; the use of a lunge whip with any type of appendage or attachment, including but not limited to bags and flags; excessive and/or disruptive cracking of the whip. In addition, after consultation with the Competition Manager and a Competition Steward, additional penalties, including one or more of the following: the issuance of an official warning card, disqualification from competing within the upcoming 24-hour period, or disqualification from the balance of the competition. All such violations must be recorded in the Steward's Report.

JP103 Schooling

2. Schooling Supervision Requirements

- a. An individual with a C1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor license must be present in the schooling area during any Jumper class offering \$10,000 to \$24,999 in prize money. See GR1041 for conflict of interest restrictions.
- b. An individual with a "R" C1 Steward or Certified Schooling Supervisor license must be appointed to supervise schooling before and during the classes offering \$25,000 or more in prize money. See GR1041 for conflict of interest restrictions.
- c. The minimum number of required competition Steward(s) must always remain available to attend to other stewarding duties. (See GR1211.4 and GR1041)

JP111 Tack and Attire

5. The total maximum weight of equipment allowed to be added to a Horse's leg, front or hind (single or multiple boots, fetlock rings, etc.), is 500 grams or 17.637 ounces (shoe excluded). Failure to comply with this paragraph will incur disqualification.
 - a. See JP 117.2 for Classes Restricted by Age of Horse.
 - b. For classes to be included in the USEF Ranking List, the following will also apply to hind boots. Fasteners may only be Velcro, stud type, or hook type. No mechanism that allows the fastener to double back on itself or any kind of leverage to be applied to the fastener is permitted. No additional elements may be added to or inserted in the boot itself. The inside of the boot must be non-abrasive and smooth, that is, the surface must be even and there may not be any pressure points on the inside of the boot. Sheepskin linings are allowed.

JP117 Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse

7. Restrictions. See also specific restrictions in each age category above. Horses competing in Five, Six, or Seven Year Old jumper classes are restricted from cross entering into any class at the same competition that is more than 10 centimeters higher than their respective age group's maximum height. For example, if a horse is jumping in a Five Year Old Jumper class at 1.20m (after July 1st), they may enter classes up to 1.30m, but not higher.

4. 1.10/1.15m Amateur classes will have courses set at 1.10m (3'7") to 1.15m (3'9"). - f. Table II Sec.2(e)—Time first jump-off with designated number of competitors to jump-off. The first round is decided by

adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed, if any. Following the first round a pre-determined number of competitors based on faults and time will compete in one timed jump-off round in which time will decide in the event of equality of total faults from both rounds. One of the following options must be used:

1. The pre-determined number must be from 6 to 16 but in no case more than the number of places to be awarded, the exact number to be indicated in the prize list (exception: all clear rounds return). The order of go for the jump-off round will be reverse order of scores (faults and time) from the first round. Adjustment of this order, in the case of one rider qualifying multiple horses, may be allowed at management's discretion.
2. The pre-determined number must be from 6 to 16 but in no case more than the number of places to be awarded, the exact number to be indicated in the prize list. Those tied for the final predetermined number, including clear rounds, will be determined by their time in the first round. The order of go for the jump-off round will be reverse order of scores (faults and time) from the first round. Adjustment of this order, in the case of one rider qualifying multiple horses, may be allowed at management's discretion.
